Suvarnabhumi Airport implements new environmental friendly policy

Suvarnabhumi Airport implements “Green and Clean Airport” policy to help save the environment by using electric carts in the Baggage Sorting Area.

Mr. Nirandra Theeranartsin, the General Manager of Suvarnabhumi Airport, Airports of Thailand Public Company Limited (AOT), said that the Airport has implemented an environmental friendly “Green and Clean Airport” policy by introducing electric carts into service at the Baggage Sorting Area since the beginning of the year, on the 1st January 2010.

Mr. Nirandra explained further that the use of electric carts for the transportation of baggage in the Baggage Sorting area is an energy saving measure of reducing the consumption of fuel. Also, as this area is situated in the basement of the Passenger Terminal building, using electric carts instead of those that use gas/oil will create a better environment in the work place.

Mr. Nirandra concluded that many leading airports in both Asia and Europe are already using electric carts and cars for many functions within the airport to help save the environment, with some country even introducing this policy as a law. Suvarnabhumi Airport is now the fifth airport in Asia to be using electric carts; after Singapore’s Changi, Hong Kong International, Kuala Lumpur International and Tokyo’s Narita International airports.
